Preface

The objective of this booklet is:

- 1. To introduce Quranic Verses revealed in the excellence of Ameerul Momineen Imam Ali Ibn Abi Talib (a.s.)
- 2. To support the verses with a brief exegesis (Tafseer) from Shia and Ahle Tasannun sources
- 3. To establish the fact that both Shia and Ahle Tasannun are unanimous in their viewpoint regarding these verses being revealed in the excellence of the Ahlul Bait (a.s.), especially Ameerul Momineen Imam Ali Ibn Abi Talib (a.s.)





Verse 1: Verse of Mastership (Wilaayah)

Arabic & Translation

"Certainly, only Allah is your Master and His Messenger and those who believe, those who establish prayers and pay the poor-rate while they bow."

[Surah Maaedah (5): Verse 55]

Shia Viewpoint

Imam Muhammad Baqir (a.s.) said:

"The Messenger of Allah (s.a.w.a.) was praying one day in the mosque when a poor person passed by him (s.a.w.a.). So, Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) asked him, 'Has anyone given you any charity?' The person replied, 'Yes, I passed by a man who was bowing (in a state of Ruku') and he gave me his ring' and (saying this) he pointed with his hand towards Ali Ibn Abi Talib (a.s.). So this verse was revealed that "Certainly, only Allah is your Master and His Messenger and those who believe, those who establish prayers and pay the poor-rate while they bow." Then Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) said, 'He – viz. Ali (a.s.) – is your Master after me."

"Certainly, only Allah is your Master and His Messenger and those who believe" they are the Imams (a.s.).

Ahle Tasannun Narrations

Ibn Abbas narrates:

"Ali (a.s.) gave his ring in charity while he was bowing (in Ruku'). Then Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) asked the beggar: 'Who gave you this ring?' He replied: 'That person who is bowing (in Ruku').' Then Allah revealed "Certainly, only Allah is your Master and His Messenger and those who believe, those who establish prayers and pay the poor-rate while they bow."

Verse 2: Verse of Best of Men (Khair al-Bariyyah)

Arabic & Translation

"Surely those who believe and do good deeds, they are the best of men."

[Surah Bayyinah (98): Verse 7]

Shia Viewpoint

Imam Baqir (a.s.) narrates that Ameerul Momineen (a.s.) said:

"... I heard the Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) reciting this verse. Then he turned towards me and said, 'they, by Allah, are you and your Shias'..."

"By the One in whose hand is my life, surely he and his Shias are the excellent ones"

Then this verse was revealed. Then whenever the companions of the Prophet (s.a.w.a.) used to meet Ali (a.s.), they would say, the best of creation (Khair al-Bariyyah) has come.

Verse 3: Verse of Delivering (Balligh)

Arabic & Translation

يَاأَيُّهَا الرَّسُولُ بَلِّغُمَا أُنْزِلَ إِلَيْكَ مِنْ رَّيِكَ وَإِنْ لَمْ تَفْعَلْ فَمَا بَلَّغُت رِسَالَتَهُ وَاللهُ يَعْصِمُكَ مِنَ النَّاسِ إِنَّ اللَّهُ اللَّهُ يَعْصِمُكَ مِنَ النَّالَ اللهَ لَا يَهْدِي الْقَوْمَ الْكَافِرِيْنَ اللهَ لَا يَهْدِي اللهَ لَا يَهْدِي الْقَوْمَ الْكَافِرِيْنَ

"O Messenger! Deliver what has been revealed to you from your Lord; and if you do it not, then you have not delivered His message, and Allah will protect you from the people; surely Allah will not guide the unbelieving people."

Shia Viewpoint

Imam Ja'far Sadiq (a.s.) said:

"When the Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) was returning from his last Hajj, Jibraeel (a.s.) descended upon him and said, "O Messenger! Deliver what has been revealed to you from your Lord; and if you do it not, then you have not delivered His message, and Allah will protect you from the people" So the Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) called out to the people and then they gathered... he (s.a.w.a.) said, "O people! Who is your master and who has more authority upon you than yourselves?" They replied, "Allah and His Messenger (s.a.w.a.)." Then he (s.a.w.a.) announced, "Of whomsoever I am the master, then Ali (a.s.) is his master."

Verse 4: The Verse of Perfection (Ikmaal)

Arabic & Translation

"This day have I perfected for you your religion and completed My favor on you and chosen for you Islam as a religion"

[Surah Maaedah (5): Verse 3]

Shia Viewpoint

Imam Sadiq (a.s.) said:

"On this day, your religion has become complete by the appointment of the one who will protect it, and I have completed My bounties upon you through our mastership and I am pleased with Islam as a religion for you i.e., the submission of a person to Our command.

Abu Hurairah said,

"... and on the day of Ghadeer the Prophet (s.a.w.a.) took the hand of Ali Ibn Abi Talib (a.s.), then he said, 'Am I not the master of the believers?' They replied, 'Yes O Prophet of Allah!' He (s.a.w.a.) further said, 'the one for whom I am his master, then Ali is his master.' Then Umar Ibn Khattab said, 'Congratulations, congratulations to you O Ibn Abi Talib! Today you have become my master and the master of every Muslim.' then Allah revealed the verse, **this day I have perfected for you your religion**.

Verse 5: The Verse of the Foremost Ones (Saabiqoon)

Arabic & Translation

"And the foremost are the foremost, These are they who are drawn near (to Allah),"

[Surah Waaqeah (56): Verses 10-11]

Shia Viewpoint

Imam Hasan Ibn Ali (a.s.) narrates from Ameerul Momineen (a.s.) concerning this verse who said regarding this verse,

"Surely, I am the first to believe in Allah and His Messenger and I am the closest confidante of Allah and His Messenger."

Ibn Abbas narrates from Holy Prophet (s.a.w.a.) about this verse that the Jibraeel (a.s.) informed him that it refers to Imam Ali (a.s.) and his Shias. They will be the foremost to enter Paradise and will be the closest to Allah due His bounties upon them.
